KSOU, Mysore has a long and rich tradition of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) with a view to reach out to the educational aspirants of the socially, economically and geographically marginalized sections of society. The erstwhile institute of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education (ICC & CE) was started a way back in 1969 by university of Mysore – the sixth oldest University of the country and the first University of the State of Karnataka.

On the recommendations of the Central Educational Advisory Board, MHRD Government of India, set up in pursuance of NPE-1986, the KSOU was established in the cultural capital of the state and the educational hub, Mysore.

Headed by His Excellency, the Governor of Karnataka, who is the Ex-Officio Chancellor, while the Minister for Higher Education is the Ex-Officio Pro-Chancellor, and the Vice-Chancellor is the principal Academic and Executive officer of the university, the KSOU is a body corporate comprising of the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, the members of BoM, Academic Council, Dean (Academic), Registrar (Evaluation), Finance officer among other officers of the university.

The contribution of the KSOU for the ODL system is invaluable. With the entire State has its jurisdiction, KSOU has established 21 Regional Centers, in addition to recognizing a good number of affiliated Colleges as Study Centers across the State. Significant is the role of KSOU in enhancing the GER of the State. In terms of providing quality and relevant education, the role of KSOU is commendable. The Courses, Curriculum, Study Materials, Contact Classes, Method of Testing, Transparency in the conduct of Examination, Evaluation and announcement of results.

The quality of SLMs, Radio talks, audio-video lecturers produced 'in-house studios' housed on the main campus have earned the admiration of a large community of distance learners across the Country as well as outside the Country. 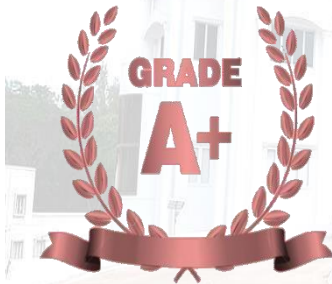

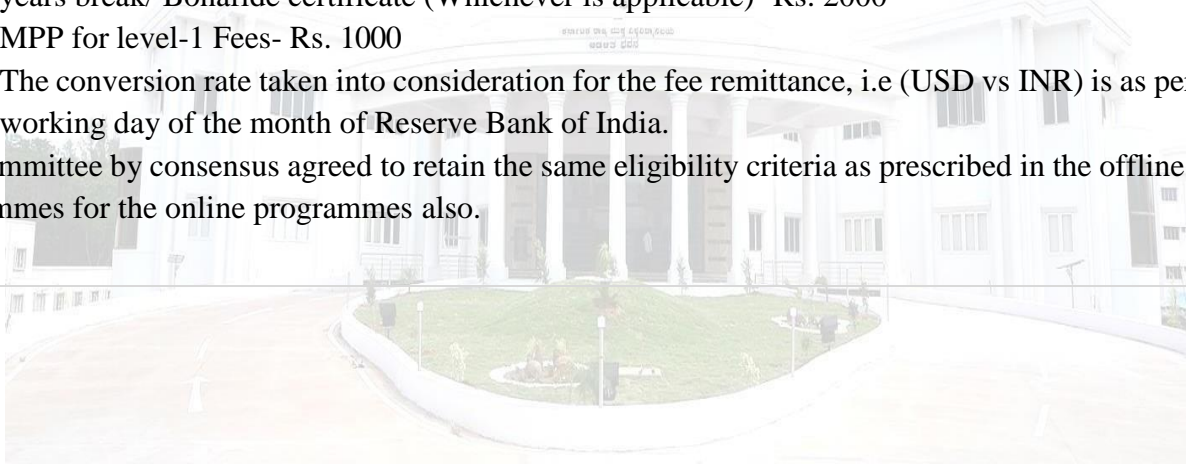

2. Create Password: MUST contain at least 8 characters, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter, one number, one special characters (!\$%&**-.;<+>?).
3. After Registration fill the Personal and Programmes details.
4. After completing your application form, upload clear colored scanned documents.
5. After documents upload, you need to pay processing fee.
6. After processing fee payment, your application is forwarded to the KSOU verification department.
7. After verification you will get email confirmation for the further admission process.
8. After successful admission, students will be able to login to the LMS Application using their mobile number provided during admission.

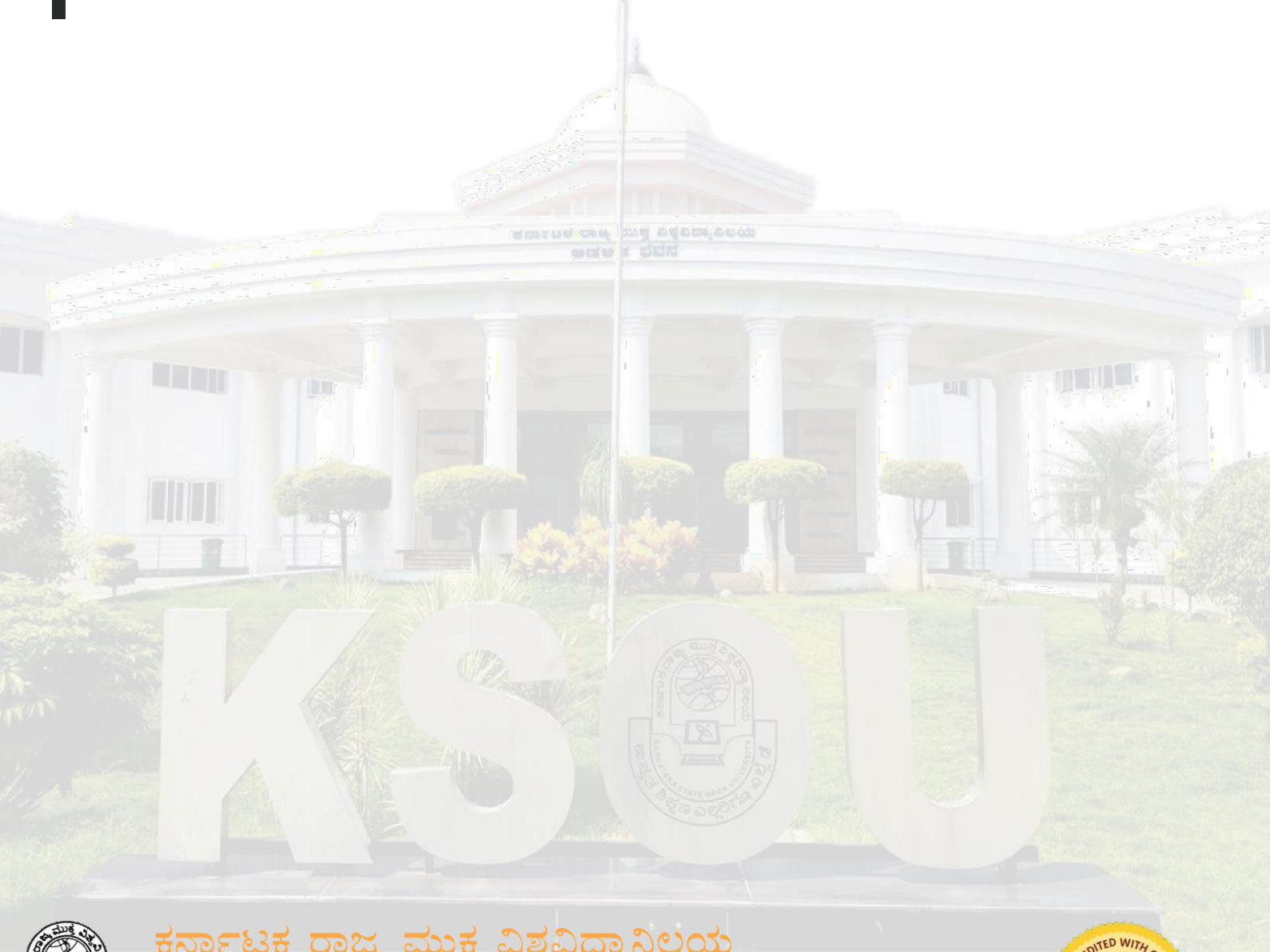
